## **WORKSHOP GADGETS**

Introduction to the articles on tools or gadgets, by Leon Kamffer:

There is a lot of ways to build a loco or model, and with modern techniques one can do it a lot faster. There is also a lot of special jigs and tools one can also make to speed things up and to assist in making a bunch of parts much quicker and accurate. I usually build a tool or gadget between locos, and collected quite a few over the years. Usually the ideas and plans are from published articles, Youtube videos, internet search or even just a need for a special job. Every month we will include a short writeup of one of the tools or gadgets that help to build easier and faster. If you are interested to build one please come and have a look at the item, ask for dimensions or even close up photos and design your own. They definitely save more time than they take to build.

There are quite a few occasions when one wants to quickly do some work on apart that is already in the lathe that require indexing. In 99% of the cases, it is a simple division of 2, 4, or 6 that is required. A lot of smaller lathes people use some detent on the back gear, but in a closed headstock lathe one needs a different solution.

A simple attachment that can be very quickly deployed with a spring-loaded detent is easy and simple to make from a few on hand materials. It is a once off job to index chucks in the dividing head and drill 12 holes in the backplate. A good tip and a bit of extra work is to align the chuck so that one jaw is parallel to the bed and mark the first hole before indexing and drilling.

The concept is simple and easier explained with a foto. Each lathe will require a simple different design as dictated by the lathe dimensions. It can be left in place between multiple machining operations as it is completely out of the way.



It is used a lot of times for milling a quick square or hexagon on a brass fitting, or just scribing a few division lines on a part. A lightweight small milling head in a vertical slide fitting in a toolholder is used for this, which will be described in future.
