Place: Home of Charles Viljoen, the longest active model engineer in South Africa. He was born next to the railway tracks and his place is something to see!





Sell / Swop / Wanted pages

I am a current long standing member of the Port Elizabeth Model Locomotive Society in Port Elizabeth and I moved to Port Alfred a year and a half ago. For me personally it is not financially viable to drive to Port Elizabeth and return so I have sadly decided to sell my 5 inch gauge electric locomotive and its ride on as there is no track in Port Alfred to make use of the asset.

The loco has a 500 watt 36 volt electric motor driven by two chains and sprockets providing power to both the driving shafts. A plug in controller is used to operate the unit and it has both forward and reverse capability with a built in hooter press in switch. A front and rear light has also been installed. There are two sets of 3 batteries (36V) located within the locomotive and the ride on which are coupled together. Two plug in charging ports have been separately installed and included are two 36V charging units. The ride on has a disk brake for very effective stopping.

The locomotive was designed and built by Leon Cloete from Despatch and I have had it for 4 years. Both units are in immaculate condition and have hardly been used!
