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CSME Member's Workshop Report: Neil Webb

New Rings for 3 ½ " Britannia

This loco was built in the 1980's and stood on a shelf for several decades having hardly been steamed. I acquired it in April 2024. After some minor maintenance to replace the valve stem packing and the sight glass, I successfully steamed it on the bench. In July 2024 i attempted to run it on the track but I had to give up. The cylinders were blowing past and it had no tractive effort. On removing one of the pistons I found the "ring" was square woven packing, which hardly even contacted the cylinder wall. Leon pointed me in the direction of silicone O-ring backed PTFE rings. I measured up and acquired suitable O-rings and carbon filled PTFE tube. The next issue was chucking the 45mm ø tube in my lathe. Temporary solution was to grip a 200mm chuck in my 4-jaw. Not very secure but good enough for turning PTFE. (The 200mm chuck has a 50mm ø bore, which my Emco V10-P does not) The pistons with new rings have now been fitted - still rather stiff, steam test next. The sequence of operations is shown in the photographs:




