#### Visit to Hannes Paling and his workshop.

On arrival Hannes had arranged snacks coffee and tea for us so we started off with the refreshments and a natter session. We moved over to his workshop/factory to see the machines and locomotives and extensive layout of HO & G gauges. Hannes and his son Jan had programmed the machine on the right of picture 3 to produce a brass quick coupler tap hose fitting as a demonstration for us to operate, so some of us operated the machine.
