(I.e all drivers – not just those hauling passengers).

Members wishing to run their own locos over the weekend are advised to bring their own riding cars as we may not have spare trucks to loan out. All CSME wagons are primarily allocated to passenger hauling. As the outer track will most likely be busy, members are requested to use the inner track for their own pleasure and stress levels.

We require items for display like small engines, projects under construction or items of any hobby including Ladies hobbies. This is a hobbies fair not just a steam event. Any radio hams out there who would set up a working demo radio link?

We intend having a table for bits and pieces for sale by members. (There is an opportunity for a member to assist with a stint on that!)

July Track Day.

Considering Sunday was rather a cold day with a cold wind the attendance of public was reasonable and kept our usual drivers busy. Other locos seen in steam were two 5" Hunslets of Paul and Carel. We celebrated the 88th birthday of Nic Popich who is still going strong and is still building new locos. Passenger hauling was again with our stalwarts Leon, Alex, Rocco and Michael. Once again the Ladies provided a table laden with goodies, and those members who did not attend really missed out. **Thank you ladies once again.**

Track and grounds

Plans are afoot to build new storage tunnels for our new electric locos & rolling stock above previous flood levels and adjacent to the compressor house, so you will see changes shortly as trees are removed (Replacements will be planted elsewhere) and earthworks started. Keiapple plants are doing well and we have some ready to plant out at the first rains

Monday and Saturday Gangs

The Monday gang has been busy with ongoing electrical maintenance, new passenger control railings on the station, surveillance and alarm upgrades, wiring, making battery clamping frames for the electric locos, plant nursery maintenance, and other numerous odd jobs.

The Saturday gang again advanced the electric loco building with wiring and fitting of controllers and the wiring and fitting of motor suppression kits. the Monday gang continued with wiring the motors to the controllers, testing the direction of motor operation so that all motors operated in the same direction at the same time despite mounting orientation, fitting of rubber mats for the battery trays, fitting batteries and clamps, making the clamp bolts, and linking the batteries. Then we got to the stage where we could not resist firing up for a test run on the first loco to reach this stage! The other two locos should be at the same stage before the august track day.

The Monday gang have put up these barriers but the job is not finished and work is continuing.
