SA-CNC AGENDA FOR SATURDAY 17 FEB 2018 - 14:00

The day was not as busy as some track days probably because the public was recovering from the financial pressures of the holiday season. Some of us were more laid back but Louw & Antoinette were kept busy in the Kiosk. A thank you is due to the wives and kitchen ladies who made the goodies for the tea table.

There was one incident with an empty train.....

The day started well, no rain sunshine going to be a good day.

Leon was with the Garratt in steam early, as was Alex with Tim in petrol, not too busy but the long track was the choice of the day so your editor thought as there were not going to be any more passenger haulers on the track he would bring out Barry as it was easy and a pleasure to drive in its new form after rebuild.

All went well and after a few laps he thought what a pleasure to drive the new loco with passenger trucks fitted with new couplings reducing the possibility of derailments.

Three trains on the track passengers not waiting too long all drivers spacing the trains out and taking care at the two diamond crossings, not too busy a day.

Later as passengers tailed off Barry and the train was sitting in platform 2 empty so the editor thought he would move it out of the way of the other two trains and pulled out of the station over the first points and disaster! The second points were the wrong way and he missed the lever and could not stop quickly enough.... derailment.... engine and riding car off and a piece of the 5" was well bent.

Any way in a big rush to clear the track a Gwala and large hammer appeared from the direction of the Boat club. With the engine and riding car removed the very bent rail was revealed.

However the Chairman and mainly Monday Gang set to and quickly a temporary repair with much hammering and persuading from the gwala allowed trains to continue for the rest of the day whilst the editor retired red faced. A photo could not be found thankfully.

Track and grounds

Unfortunately the Track and grounds were not looking good for the January track day as the grass had not been cut, however, our workforce had been hard at work with the bush cutter around the track. With the rain since the grass is looking greener and has since been cut.

The cultivation of Kei Apple seedlings for perimeter planting is progressing well to date about 400 have been delivered to site to grow to a size ready for planting out. We hope some will be large enough to put out just prior to the next rainy season. Expecting another +/- 600 to come.

Monday and Saturday Gangs

The first job on 22nd Jan. was to properly repair the points damaged in the derailment. At the same time the change levers were given attention to support the lever bases as the bases had worked loose in the concrete. Work was then continued on the security camera installation. The battery frame materials for the electric locos were prepared for welding. Kei apple seedlings were weeded, watered and space made for the new seedlings to be delivered.

Saturday 20th Jan. Electric locos, the wheels and axles were the next parts to be assembled. Work continued on the assembly of the bogies, fitting axle boxes to the wheel sets and the bogies to a stage where they are now waiting for the motors. Cutting of parts continues, and as they become available, we will need help assembling again.

Please keep in touch and join us on the working days, no workshop work needed, the design is mostly grinding parts apart, drilling, painting and assembling. Leon.

Jan. 29th diesel no.7 required attention to broken drive chains, one dead tree removed and a replacement planted, work continued on the electric loco battery carriers.

Feb. 5th one of the portable braais had the ½ barrel replaced, among other jobs.




Geoff Bailey recently sent some photos of his father Malcolm's Virginia.
