However, our fears were unfounded as the CSME members rallied to the occasion with more enthusiasm, more models to display and a healthy number of steam locomotives adding 'atmosphere' in the station.



The 'Ticket Office' opened promptly at about 9am on Saturday.

The two electrics very nearly missed out on the action. Thankfully the problems were resolved at the 11th hour and No 6 and No 8 literally pulled their weight over the weekend (and they are quite heavy).
